- The Clerk is a paid official and responsible for financial and procedural proberty

### What we do

- Parish councils are consulted on local highways, planning issues and relevant public enquiries
- Parish council responsibilities include bus shelters, drainage, footpaths and bridleways, lighting, signage, tree planting, verge maintenance, land, litter, recreation grounds, planning, public walkways, open spaces, rights of way, general planting, seating.
- A limited amount of money can be used on anything deemed to benefit the community and not covered by other specific responsibilities (grants)
